





WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGE: The Sunday Gospel describes the wedding banquet to which the groom's father invited his family and friends. But the invited guests chose not to come. 

This is a condemnation of how Israel, and the Jewish leadership in particular, treated God's messengers. So next the king sends out his servants to invite everyone, good or bad, to the feast. This is an indication that we are all invited, regardless of our "worthiness". But then something disturbing happens. One of the guests is under dressed for the feast. He is thrown out of the banquet.

This can seem unfair, especially since this guest was invited off of the street. He probably wasn't expecting to go to a wedding. But he was missing something. He was caught unprepared. Young-catholic.com
