



Whole Community Catechesis

Reading 1- Acts of the Apostles 10:34a,37-43 Peter preaches about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Reading 2 - Colossians 3:1-4 or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8 Colossians: Having been raised by Christ, be concerned with what is above. 1 Corinthians: Let us celebrate this feast with new yeast.

Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb.

Adults: Why do I believe that I will live with Christ for all eternity?

Children: Who has helped me believe that I will live with Jesus forever?

A Family Perspective
That first Easter morning was confusing. Jesus was missing and Mary Magdalene, Peter and John "did not know" what to do. In family life, there are confusing moments when "we don't know " what to do. Like the apostles, we are Easter people when we believe and trust in each other even when all seems lost.

WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGE:

The Good News of the Resurrection is proclaimed this week in our Scripture readings. And this good news is meant for everyone. Jesus was and is a universal savior. One of the insights we receive on Easter Sunday comes from Acts 10. Peter, struggling to be faithful to the teachings of Jesus, announces that he has learned that "God shows no partiality". This helped to shape many decisions made by the early Church leaders—and it should form our decisions as well. Your challenge this week is examine how well you live by God's example. Do you personally and/or as a household show partiality to particular groups of people based on their race, religion, economic level, occupation? Do you exclude any groups on the same basis? If your reflection reveals partiality to some and exclusion of others, make a commitment to change. Identify three steps you can take so that in the future you can in all sincerity say that you, like

God, show no partiality.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY will be celebrated at St. Patrick Church, Keibel Road in Whitney Point, NY on April 07, 2024 at 2:00 PM.

Fr. Thomas McCauley will be with us for confession beginning at 2:00 PM. While confessions are going on, there will be readings from St. Faustina's Diary every 10 minutes for your reflection. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be recited at 3:00 PM followed by Benediction.

NOTE: This is the only day of the year that an EXTRAORDINARY plenary indulgence can be obtained. There are 4 conditions that need to be present to gain a plenary indulgence:

1. Confession within 20 days before or after intent to perform the indulgenced act. 2. Receive Holy Communion 3. Pray for the Pope's intentions (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be) 4. Have no attachment to sin. However, it is extremely difficult to have no attachment to sin. Through the ministry of the Church, God has given us another way, which can ONLY be gained on Divine Mercy Sunday.

On this day the condition to have no attachment to sin is not required. Instead, according to Faustina's Diary #699, a soul must ASK for the graces of Divine Mercy Sunday. Here is a prayer asking to receive the graces of D.M.S: "Lord Jesus, Son of the Living God, you promised St. Faustina that the soul that has been to confession, and the soul that receives Holy Communion with trust in D.M. will receive the complete forgiveness of all sins and punishment. Lord, please give me this grace. Jesus I trust in you." Come and experience the unfathomable mercy God extends to you on that day of all days. The extraordinary indulgence cannot be applied to another soul, living or deceased, only to oneself.
