

Pastor's Column - March 24, 2024

This Sunday we begin the Holiest week of the Church year. Today we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and how he was greeted by the people waving palms. Our Mass quickly takes a turn as we read from the Passion of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. We are taught that true glory and happiness comes only when we embrace the crosses in our lives.

On Monday evening Fr. Thomas will be at St. Stephen's Church in Marathon from 4:00-7:00PM participating in the Diocesan-wide program "The Light is on for you." This is an excellent opportunity for all of us to encounter our Lord Jesus in a special way in the Sacrament of Confession. This is a wonderful and traditional way to prepare for the feast of Easter.

On Tuesday morning Fr. Thomas and I will be attending the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Syracuse. It is at this Mass that all the oils that are used for the sacraments in the upcoming year.

On Holy Thursday we will have the Mass of the Lord's Supper at St. Patrick's Church in Whitney Point at 6:00PM. This Mass recalls how the Lord Jesus instituted the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Holy Orders on this holy evening.

On Good Friday we will have the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion at 6:00PM at St. Stephen's Church in Marathon. It is at this liturgy that we recall the depth of God's love for us as we recall His passion and death.

The Solemn Easter Vigil will take place at St. Patrick's church at 8:00PM on Holy Saturday evening. On this evening the fire is blessed, the Holy water is blessed and Fr. Thomas will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation as Kim Wheeler is accepted into the Church.

On Easter Sunday, we will have Mass in St. Stephen's Church at 10:15 and at Our Lady of Perpetual Help at 12:00 noon. Make your plans now to accompany our Lord Jesus during this holiest week of the year.



Palm Sunday begins with jubilation as Jesus enters into Jerusalem. The crowd cheers and shouts "Hosana" while waving palms. As participants in today's liturgy, we are immersed into the readings, doing the same actions.

As we continue in the Liturgy of the Word, we, the crowd, journey with Jesus to the Cross.

As the Gospel is read, the crowd in Jerusalem quickly changes their tone. Shouts of joyful "Hosana" become angry demands, "Crucify him!" We come to realize that Jesus is sacrificing himself for our sinfulness.

Jesus loves us beyond imagination. He is our Savior. Holy Week invites us all to let go of self love and embrace the Lord anew by saying 'Yes' to the invitation to continuing conversion.

How desperately we all need to hear the Good News that we can begin again! As we begin this journey with Jesus, we can identify times in our lives when we too may have felt abandoned. All of our own sufferings can be shared in the passion of Christ. His suffering was not in vain but rather became a source of abundant life for us.

So our suffering and times of feeling alone can be joined to Christ and transformed by God into a source of life. Christ promises to be with us so we never are left alone. (Living Liturgy, Liturgical Press. 2024. pg. 89,)

Scripture Verse of the Week From Sunday's Mass: Christ became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name.

-Philippians 2:9-10 Practice reverence in Mass this week and every week. Genuflect when passing in front of the tabernacle. Silently say a prayer as you gaze upon the crucifix. Participate prayerfully during the Mass.

Be reverent to others outside of the church.

Pray - Read and pray with the Holy Week Scriptures (USCCB.org)

Fast - Add an extra day of fasting this week

Give - Catholic Charities is in need of basic food and personal care items
