25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B - September 22, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

Grace and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ be with you and your family! The Gospel for the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B (Mark 9:30-37) tells of the apostles arguing about who is the greatest. Jesus teaches them that true greatness comes from being humble and serving others. He used a child to illustrate that we must welcome and care for those who are seen as least important. This passage shows that comparing ourselves to others leads to jealousy and ambition. Instead, we should appreciate our own unique gifts and use them to serve God, others and glorify God. 



Readings and Questions for Discussion

Introduction

Reading 1 - Wisdom 2:12,17-20 **Righteous Suffering**

The wicked plot to test the righteous man with insults and torture,

challenging his faith and patience, and plan to condemn him to a disgraceful death to see if God will protect him.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 54 A Prayer for Defense.

O God, save and defend us. Hear our prayer regarding the proud and ruthless. You are our helper and support. We will praise your name, O Lord.

Reading 2 - James 3:16-4:3 Humility in Service and Peaceful Living. Jealousy and selfishness cause disorder and evil. Wisdom from above is pure and peaceable. Wars come from inner desires and ungodly rivalries. We must seek what brings glory to God and salvation to others.

Gospel - Mark 9:30-37 Put Others First, (selfless love). lesus taught his disciples about his death and resurrection. In Capernaum, he addressed their argument about greatness, teaching that true greatness comes from being last and serving all, using a child as an example.

Questions For Reflection: This Sunday we reflect on themes of humility, service and Christian life. The readings guide us to consider how we live out our faith in practical ways.

- How can we bring peace into 1. our community of faith?
- 2. How can we align our actions with God's will?

3. In what ways can we follow Jesus' example of humility and service?
